Professional Learning Communities at Work

At New Prairie High School, our commitment to the Professional Learning Communities at Work (PLC) process has been the cornerstone of our efforts to Ensure High Levels of Learning for ALL Students. Through intentional collaboration during daily planning time and on Late Start Fridays, our teachers analyze student data, set clear learning goals, and develop strategies to meet the diverse needs of every learner.

A key component of this process is our dedicated use of Success Time, a daily intervention block designed to provide targeted support. Success Time has become an essential element of our school-wide improvement goals, creating a flexible framework for addressing student needs. Whether students require additional practice to master essential standards or seek academic experiences to extend their learning, Success Time offers meaningful support. Students can self-enroll in sessions that align with their goals or interests. Teachers will also place students in specific sessions based on results from common formative assessments, ensuring they receive assistance where it's needed most. This proactive approach has strengthened academic outcomes and empowered students to take ownership of their success.

Scheduling Information

Scheduling for the 25-26 school year will begin in January. The Guidance Department will hold class meetings during Success Time after Winter Break to introduce the scheduling process to students in grades 9-11.

Students will then meet individually with their school counselor to review graduation requirements and select courses for next year. Student course selections will be entered in PowerSchool during the student's meeting. After the scheduling meeting, student course selection sheets will be emailed to students and parents for review. School Counselors can be contacted with any questions or concerns. The master schedule for the 25-26 school year will be created based on the student course requests.

The 25-26 Curriculum Guide link will be emailed and posted on the NPHS website in January. We encourage students to use careful thought when selecting courses for next year. Students choosing year-long courses are making a commitment for two semesters. Students will not be taken out of a year-long course at semester. We will do our best to schedule the requested courses; however, we do not honor specific teacher or lunch requests.

School counselors are always available throughout this process, please feel free to contact your student's assigned counselor with questions.





NPHS Science Department Spotlight

The Biology classes just finished the unit over Cell Basics, which included Characteristics of Life, Cell Theory, Prokaryotic vs Eukaryotic Cells, Cell Organelles and their functions, and the Cell Cycle (including Mitosis and DNA Replication). Honors Biology also learned the parts of a microscope and how to properly use the microscope and spent a day practicing microscope skills and looking at cells, as well as other fun things in the microscopes! We will finish the semester with a unit on Cellular Transport. This unit will include the Egg Lab where students will get to see osmosis and diffusion in action! Be sure to ask your biology students about the Egg Lab after Thanksgiving Break!

Students in Mrs Aerts PLTW Human Body Sytems have been exploring the parts and function of the brain. Everything from the anatomy of the brain to what happens when things go wrong, this lesson is definitely something that everyone can relate to.

In addition, students completed 2 online courses offered by HFC. HFC is a national non-profit organization whose mission is to care for families impacted by Alzheimer's disease and related dementias, inspire the next generation of Alzheimer's advocates, and be leaders in brain health research and education. HFC was founded in 2012 by Seth Rogen and Lauren Miller Rogen.

Students will wrap up this unit with the community viewing of Taking Care. "Directed and produced by award-winning filmmaker James Keach, Taking Care is a 38-minute documentary following the journey of acclaimed filmmakers Seth Rogen and Lauren Miller Rogen as they navigate the complexities and heartbreak of Lauren's mother's advancing Alzheimer's disease. Through humor, heart, and an unwavering commitment to change, Taking Care imparts a message of hope, resilience, and the profound impact individuals can have when they seek solutions to society's greatest challenges."
