SAT School Day Information - March 4th

NPHS staff has set a school-wide goal for improving SAT scores for our Junior class based on the SAT School Day Test. We will be actively assisting students in understanding the test format, types and rigor of questions, and strategies useful for standardized testing. Additional preparation sessions will be held during Success time, and students may be assigned multiple sessions based on PSAT data. PSAT scores, along with a score report letter were sent home to all 9th-11th grade students who took the PSAT in October.

Students also have access to online practice materials through their CollegeBoard accounts. Once logged in, students can take practice tests in Bluebook or even on Khan Academy. You can <u>click here</u> for a link to access Khan Academy's Free Digital SAT Prep. The SAT School Day Test for all NPHS juniors is tentatively scheduled for March 4th, 2025.

WHY THE SAT MATTERS

- Doing well on the SAT demonstrates strong academic skills in critical reading, writing, and math. This not only boosts confidence but also provides a clear signal to colleges and future employers of a student's readiness to succeed in challenging environments.
- Many colleges and universities use SAT scores as part of their admissions process. A high score can make a student a more competitive candidate, increasing their chances of getting into their preferred schools.
- High SAT scores can qualify students for merit-based scholarships, reducing the financial burden of college. Some programs, such as National Merit Scholarships, are directly tied to standardized test performance.







Attendance

Sudent attendance continues to be one of the biggest challenges that schools face today. When students are present in class, they have a better opportunity to learn new materials and master content with their teachers. NPHS is striving to increase attendance above 95% throughout the school year, part of that is through quarterly incentives. Grade levels compete against one another to have the highest in-person attendance rate to earn special treats. It is also worth noting that student attendance rates must be above 90% in order to be approved for school-sponsored activities such as field trips and school dances.

NPHS CTE Department Leverages Cutting-Edge Technology

The Career and Technical Education (CTE) Department at New Prairie High School is equipping students with 21st-century skills through the use of innovative technology. Students in various CTE programs are utilizing state-of-the-art equipment such as a Glow Forge laser cutter, a Cricut cutting machine, and a professional t-shirt press. These tools allow students to develop practical skills in design, fabrication, and production. Furthermore, the CTE Department fosters creativity and communication through the production of video and audio podcasts. This provides students with valuable experience in multimedia creation, storytelling, and digital communication. By integrating these advanced technologies, the NPHS CTE Department is preparing students for success in today's rapidly evolving job market.





NPHS Business Students Explore Management Styles with LEGO

Mr. Clemons' Principles of Business Management class at New Prairie High School recently embarked on a unique learning experience, utilizing LEGO bricks to understand different management styles.

Divided into groups, students were tasked with creating two different models using distinct management approaches.

- Classic Management: This group focused on strict adherence to rules, clear division of labor, and a top-down approach.
 They emphasized efficiency and productivity, prioritizing the timely completion of the vehicles.

Second Semester Updates

FAFSA Information

The state of Indiana is now requiring that every senior file the FAFSA. This requirement applies to ALL students in the Class of 2025 regardless of their postsecondary plans. FAFSA opened on December 1, 2024. Please make sure that you have created an account at <u>studentaid.gov</u>, requested your FSA IDs and work on filing the FAFSA. If you need any help, the people at INvestED Indiana offer free FAFSA help, and they are amazing! You can contact an INvestED team member at 317–715–9007. We encourage you to watch for more information on College Goal Sunday, Indiana's largest FAFSA filing event, to be held on Sunday, February 23, 2025. You can also reach out to your student's school counselor for assistance.

Course Selection

Scheduling for the 25-26 school year will begin in January. The Guidance Department will hold class meetings during Success Time after Winter Break to introduce the scheduling process to students. Individual course selection meetings will then be held with students currently in grades 9 - 11. Completed course request sheets will be emailed to students and parents. All scheduling communication will be done via email so be sure to check for information throughout the spring semester.
